Swimming and Water Safety in 2021-2022:

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety	The number of children in Year 6 at the end of summer 2021 was 8.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 meters? N.B. Even though your children may swim in another year please report on their attainment on leaving primary school.	Of these 8 children, 87.5% have demonstrated that they can swim 25 meters competently and confidently.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	87.5% have demonstrated that they can use a range of strokes effectively.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	87.50% have demonstrated that they can perform a safe self-rescue procedure. This aspect of the curriculum was missed this year.
